### CONTEXT

The College recognises that students may require for a variety of reasons to withdraw from a programme. Moreover, the College acknowledges that students making a decision to withdraw from their programme of study should be supported to explore other options available to them, with withdrawal seen as a last resort. All students considering withdrawal from their studies should seek academic advice and student guidance. While all faculty and the Student Support Officer are available to discuss a withdrawal decision, the student will be required to discuss their decision formally with the Registrar, the Programme Director and the Director of Studies. The College is also obliged to inform the student that their decision has important implications.

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

ICHAS recognises and supports the rights of learners to withdraw from their programme of study. The College supports students who make such choices and aims provide pastoral support for students making such decisions. Formal identification of voluntary suspension must also occur with the student being informed of all implications arising from the change in status which occurs after withdrawal.
