CONTEXT

The Irish College of Humanities & Applied Sciences welcomes and values International Students within our college community and recognises the cultural diversity which they bring and the exchange of values between cultures enhances and enriches the overall student experience. It is important, however that the College meets its obligations in relation to the admission of International students. The Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS) have issued detailed guidance to colleges and potential students and it is vital that reference is made to their requirements when considering applications from Non-EEA and Non-EU countries. In that context, it is vital to recognise the distinction they identify between the requirements stipulated to hold a Visa to enter Ireland and requirements necessary to study in Ireland. For Non-EEA/ Non-EU students wishing to apply for a place on one of our undergraduate or postgraduate programmes please note the following important information applies.

Most students holding a Non-EAA/ Non-EU passport are required to have a valid visa to study in Ireland. Please refer to the INIS website for more comprehensive information and also direct potential applicants to the website also. However, in summary, there are generally two categories of applicants who need to be considered:

- Students who need a visa before they travel to Ireland
- Students who can enter Ireland without a visa and who can apply for their student visa after they arrive in Ireland.
